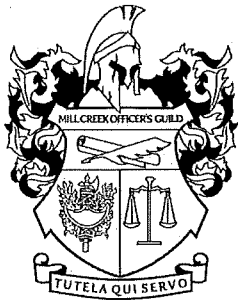

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Six-Month Statute of Limitations Extension

The Mill Creek Police Officers' Guild and the City of Mill Creek have discussed the Guild filing an unfair labor practice complaint over Chief Elwin's December 27, 2016 order to patrol sergeants that patrol employees' modified shifts be "adjusted" when possible to avoid overtime expense. The City of Mill Creek expressly waives the six-month statute of limitations period for filing an unfair labor practice regarding the Chief's December 27th order by extending the limitations period by six months, which would be subject to further extension upon the City of Mill Creek's express agreement.
